

James: Playing Favorites

Life Group Discussion Questions:

- 1. Thinking back on this week's sermon, is there a particular point you recall that caught your attention or you found challenging or confusing?
- 2. Read **James 2:1-13**. The big idea is: The church should be a place of acceptance without favoritism. How have you seen favoritism in the church? (any church—not necessarily Grace Church) How about acceptance? Give some examples.
- 3. The first truth Derek shared is: our standard of acceptance is Jesus and not our culture. Why was Jesus born into a humble family in an obscure town? Can you give examples of how Jesus interacted with and loved the wealthy? (Nicodemus; Zaccheus [Luke 19]; Joseph of Arimathea) How did Jesus love the unlovable? (demon-possessed; those with disgusting illnesses [Matthew 8:2-3]; woman who committed adultery; Samaritan woman [John 4])
- 4. Read **James 2:2-6**. The second truth is: we must never let our preferences become prejudices. What does this mean? How have you seen this in your own life?
- 5. According to **James 2:8** what is the solution to prejudice? Share some ways you can love others by trying to see the world through their eyes.
- 6. "Mercy triumphs over judgment." (James 2:13) is the heart of the third truth. Usually we want mercy for ourselves while giving judgment to others. How would focusing on mercy destroy favoritism?

Next Steps: a) Find your chair and do the 5 daily readings for this week; b) Think of a person who is difficult for you to love and intentionally extend mercy to that person this week. c) As a group make a plan to hold each other accountable for these steps.

Prayer Thought: Read Psalm 139:13-18

Father, You created every person and each one we meet is priceless to You. Help us to see the people around us with Your eyes--especially those who are different than we are and difficult for us to love. Give us Your love for them this week, we pray. Amen.
